Horsley Woodhouse Parish Council

A member of the public requested a name plate on Church Street be erected as an ambulance was unable to find an address recently when someone required urgent medical attention. The Parish Clerk (Kay Richardson) to contact Amber Valley and to ask Royal Mail if this area could have its own post code.

WW1 Remembrance Poppies – Parish Councillors agreed to buy one kilo of red poppy seeds for distribution in the Parish.

Police Matters

Parish Clerk to inform PSCO Vicky Hill of problems of cars being parked on the pavement along the Main Road, making it difficult for people with pushchairs etc. to walk on the pavement.

Action on outstanding issues:

Parish Clerk to ask DCC what will happen to the lamps when they are removed, considering such a lot of investment from the Parish Council has been put into these street lamps over the years would the Parish Council be receiving the scrap value.

Cllr Crowder has taken the revised School Centenary plaques to the Primary School.

Parish Clerk reported that the Footpath Officer from Amber Valley emailed regarding the aggressive ram in the field adjacent to The Haven bungalow. She advised that if the keeper of the animal is aware of the animal's tendency to be aggressive, a warning sign should be erected to inform members of the public when walking the footpath. However, it would be advisable to keep the animal in a field not crossed by a footpath.

To mark the passing of 100 years since the start of the First World War many organisations are planting poppy seeds in their towns and villages. Horsley Woodhouse Parish Council, amongst others, would like to join in this national campaign to see real poppies across the UK.

Seeds will be scattered throughout the village on common land and recreation grounds. Please contact the Parish Council if you would like to take part in this event as more seeds are available for parishioners who would like to plant poppies in their gardens. In this way we can have poppies in every street in the village.

You are also welcome to purchase your own seeds; B & Q are backing the national campaign and are selling packets of Flanders poppy seeds for £2.00 with £1.00 of this going to the Royal British Legion.

‘We Will Remember Them’

Horsley Woodhouse Servicemen who have no known grave:

Sapper Frederick Norman Weston, Royal Engineers - 580 Army Troops Company WW2

Born in 1914, Frederick was the son of Norman and Cora Weston of Horsley Woodhouse and the brother of Ray, Geoff, Audrey and Una. Frederick grew up in the locality and eventually married a girl from Ambergate, Frances Mary (maiden name unknown to me at the time of writing – perhaps someone can supply this?).

Frederick saw action in World War II, serving with 580 Army Troops Company, Royal Engineers in the earlier part of the conflict. The Corps of Royal Engineers (usually referred to as the “Royal Engineers”) holds high esteem throughout the military, its role being to provide military engineering in support of the Forces, particularly the Army. Typical RE tasks include road and bridge-building, airfield construction, field defence works/repair, demolition and laying or clearing minefields. Frederick’s rank was that of Sapper (service No. 2113199), the term harking back in history to the French name of “Sappe” used to denote the angled trench dug in a “zig-zag” series under defensive musket and/or artillery fire to advance an attacking army’s position when besieging a bastion or fortification. Frederick would no doubt have laboured on a number of such projects during his training and service.

The ultimate part of Frederick’s war was to take place in Greece as a consequence of the British campaign there which started with the supply of air support to the hitherto neutral Greeks, following invasion of their country by Italian forces allied to Germany, in late 1940. The RAF supplied fighters and bombers, attacking Italian lines of communication and providing air cover for Greek troops. A subsequent appeal by the Greeks for further aid coincided with the British success at Benghazi (Libya) in early February 1941. The British responded with further RAF squadrons and an offer of the despatch of a British Expeditionary Force with a view to holding the Aliakmon Line from the mouth of the Aliakmon River through to the Yugoslavian border – the offer was duly accepted, the first British troops arriving in Greece on the 7th March 1941. Frederick Weston either arrived in Greece in advance of this Expeditionary Force for the purpose of providing engineering support works for the RAF or as part of the Force itself.

With Adolf Hitler keeping a “Weather Eye” on matters in Greece, it was inevitable, following Greek counter-offensive resistance, that Germany would intervene. Such intervention took the form of “Operation Marita”, the plan aiming at German occupation of the northern Greek/Aegean coast by March 1941 with a possible follow-up to seize the entire Greek mainland if required. The German attack began in the early hours of the 6th April 1941 and the corresponding impetus and penetration soon made defence of the Aliakmon Line untenable. The Allied forces made an initial withdrawal quickly followed by a fall-back of some 80 miles to a line running through Thermopylae with its echo of historic Spartan resistance. It then became apparent that the Germans were aligning for a mass attack along the

whole of this new line. The situation had become critical and by April an Allied evacuation of Greece was becoming a reality. As the days passed British aircraft were withdrawn to the Athens vicinity and losses to Australian and New Zealand ground troops mounted. Greek forces then became trapped in the Epirus locality and had to surrender. On the 21st April 1941, the Greek government asked the British to leave in the hope of preventing further destruction and loss of life.

The initial British embarkations were planned for the night of the 24th/25th April as, by this time, any daylight operations were not possible due to lack of air cover against the Luftwaffe. Following rear-guard actions by Greek troops to the West and other actions by forces of the New Zealand Division, the majority of the British Force was able to complete a successful evacuation across the isthmus of Corinth before German parachute troops took the bridge over the Corinth Canal in the early hours of the 26th April. The evacuation continued until the 30th April, British Naval forces doing sterling service until some 50,000 men had been conveyed to relative safety despite having to abandon transport, artillery pieces and other heavy equipment. Sapper Frederick Weston was, unfortunately, not amongst the survivors of the Greek campaign. He is listed as killed on active service on the 24th April 1941 during the initial stages of the evacuation. So often the case under the dire circumstances of withdrawal under fire, his body was never identified or recovered. He is commemorated on the Athens Memorial, Face 4, sited within Phaleron War Cemetery, Athens, Greece. The Memorial stands to 2,888 members of land forces of the British Commonwealth lost during the WW2 campaigns in Greece and Crete in 1941 and 1944-45, the Dodecanese Islands in 1943-45 and in Yugoslavia in 1943-45 and having no known grave.

Further details of the Athens Memorial . Above the cemetery register box is a dedication in English which reads:

“1939 – 1945”

“Within this cemetery stand monuments bearing the names of the soldiers of the British Commonwealth and Empire who gave their lives in the struggle for the defence of Greece and Crete in 1941 and in the later operations in Greece, The Dodecanese and Yugoslavia, but to whom the fortune of war denied a known and honoured grave”

Over the openings of the Memorial in ancient Greek at the south and in English to the north are the words:

“We who clothe Hellias in freedom fought lie here at rest in praise that fadeth not”

The Phaleron War Cemetery is just a few kilometres to the south east of Athens on the coast road from Athens to Vouliaghmen, 5 kilometres to the west of the International Airport. Should you ever be in the vicinity take time to remember Frederick Weston.
