
The Tug of War competition was a battle of wills this year with some great





Horsley Woodhouse Speed Watch

Over the last few years there have been an increasing number of complaints and indeed observations of speeding traffic through and around Horsley Woodhouse. There have been requests for some sort of deterrent to slow the traffic to within the acceptable speed limit due to concerns for the safety and wellbeing of our residents, and also people using the roads.

The Community Speed Watch system has been introduced where active members of local communities join with the support of the Police to monitor the speed of vehicles using speed detection devices. Vehicles found to be exceeding the speed limit are referred to the Police with the aim of educating drivers to reduce their speeds. In cases where this is blatantly ignored and evidence of repeat or excessive offences is collated, enforcement and prosecution follow.

If you are one of the many local people who have felt the need to make your voices heard on this important subject, now is your chance to actively make a difference and improve the safety and quality of life both for yourself and those around you.







New Prescription Medicines Order Line

As from 15th July, there is a new telephone number for you to request your repeat prescription - **Tel 0115 855 0260. The lines are open weekdays 9:00 am to 4:00 pm.** It will no longer be possible for you to order your prescriptions by phoning the old number.

Why are we offering this new service? The Prescription Medicines Order Line is a new and convenient way to order your repeat prescription. We believe that this new service will help ensure our patients receive the correct quantity of medication needed, in a timely manner, to reduce the amount of medication waste. The telephone lines will be open for a longer period of time and hence provide more flexibility for when you can order your repeat prescription.

Who will you be talking to? Your call will be answered by a dedicated, experienced and fully trained call handler who will have access to your medical records. The call handler will only access your personal information relevant to your request.

When will the prescription be ready? Once you have made the telephone call, your prescription will be authorised by Arthur Medical Centre and sent to the pharmacy of your choice within two working days. Please allow additional time for the pharmacy to process your request.

Are there alternatives to using this service? Yes – you may order your prescriptions online. Please contact reception if you wish to register for this. Or you may post your repeat slip into the labelled box in the entrance hall to reception.

Online Consultations with Arthur Medical Centre

Patients registered at Arthur Medical Centre can now use **'Engage Consult'**, a new online consultation system, to obtain advice about your medical problem or your medication. You can even use Engage Consult to ask our admin team a question!

How do I access 'Engage Consult'? You can access this new service by going to our website www.arthurmedicalcentre.co.uk, and then click on 'online consultations with the surgery'. By following the links you can create your own Engage Consult account and then start your online consultation or enquiry. There is also lots of helpful advice on how self-manage to many health conditions.

When will I get a reply? We aim to provide a prompt response, usually on the same day if you access the service before 11.00 am.



Ambulance First Responder

Last October Peter Oughton decided that he wanted to also help our community by training to become a Community First Responder (CFR) helping the NHS and Ambulance Service.

The main reason for the CFR group is that an ambulance can take a while to get to a CAT1 emergency (cardiac arrest) with the help of a local (community member) being trained to assist in CPR and the use of EMAS medical equipment they can be dispatched by the ambulance service to be on scene to assist before the ambulance arrives.

In an emergency the patient needs to ring 999 as normal but in certain circumstances a CFR maybe dispatched as well as an ambulance.

He is now qualified as a Level 2 CFR, this means he can assist on major trauma and cardiac arrests. Great for the community of Horsley Woodhouse and surrounding areas.


As per the June/July edition (page 17), every minute counts.

Councillor Kevin Buttery - Keeping you Updated

I am pleased to support Woodhouse Carnival again this year, the event goes from strength to strength due to the hard work and commitment of the Carnival Committee.

It would appear that about **17,000 Derbyshire Pensioners** are entitled to, but not claiming, the pension top-up, with the take-up rate for those over 75 being only 60%. Local pensioners could qualify even if they have significant savings (in the tens of thousands of pounds); they own their own home or are a couple with up to £460 a week coming in, but they both qualify for disability benefits and are carers for each other. Some people do not know they can claim, can feel embarrassed or struggle to apply because it is too complicated. Pensioners who qualify get on average about £250 a month.

I appreciate claiming benefits can be complex, but to check if you qualify, there are Council staff on hand to assist you.

It has been recognised that the number of recorded cases of

measles in the UK has increased this year. It has also increased across Europe, including France and Germany. It is highly infectious and although usually a mild illness in children, measles can be more severe in adults. Young people and adults aged 15 or over who missed out on the MMR vaccination have been particularly infected. Festivals or any other events where lots of people mix together, provide the perfect sort of environment for measles to spread. Derbyshire residents are being encouraged to check that they and their families have had two doses of the MMR vaccine before they travel abroad. This can be done via their GP.

Amber Valley Borough Council is proposing to introduce new powers to tackle irresponsible dog owners in the area via the introduction of a Public Spaces Protection Order. This order will require any person in charge of a dog to immediately remove any dog faeces from public areas and show they have a suitable bag in their possession to clean it up. Keep the dog on a lead in cemeteries and to prevent it from entering or remaining in children's play areas within parks and open spaces. Any

person in breach will be issued a Fixed Penalty Notice or prosecuted at Magistrates Courts. Assistance dogs will be exempt. The Council do not intend to increase the number of dog bins.

The Council is consulting on this issue until Friday 2nd August 2019. If approved, it will come into force on the 20th October 2019. Details can be accessed via the Amber Valley Council website

On a personal note, in my role as Chair of Derbyshire Fire & Rescue Service, it was an honour to welcome Her Royal Highness, the Princess Royal, who paid a private visit to the joint Derbyshire Police & Fire Headquarters at Ripley. This was to celebrate the two emergency services collaborating in 'Making Derbyshire Safer Together'. Her Royal Highness spent the afternoon meeting staff and undertook a tour of the new joint training centre.
