Arthur Medical Centre

Welcome back to Wudhus News readers; of course, like many people we have continued to work all-be-it in very new ways. Others of you will have been furloughed, sadly some of you may have struggled with self-employment, loss of income or been very lonely stuck in your homes unable to have the support you would normally have from your loved ones and friends.

It has been widely recognised that this pandemic and its consequences have led to an increase in mental health problems. This may be a worsening of problems that you were coping with before, or may be a new experience for you. There is a lot of support that, as doctors, we can offer you if you feel that you need help. **Please telephone to arrange to speak with a doctor.**

Much of our routine work was put on hold in March but we are beginning to restart some of this work. If you have a long-term condition for which you would have a regular review, the nurse team will be making contact with you when it is due and explaining the new arrangements. For example, we may be asking you to make recordings of your blood pressures, weight and get your blood tests done before a telephone review is done. We are restarting some of our more complex contraceptive services so if you wish to discuss options or need to renew your contraceptive implant or coil please arrange a telephone consultation. Our visiting consultants in surgery and orthopaedics are also making a comeback soon. Looking forward to autumn, we are expecting to have our biggest flu campaign ever.

We understand that our new working practices are sometimes difficult; having moved to total telephone consultations has been harder for some patients who, like us, value the face to face consultation. But most of the diagnoses we make are based on the story you tell us, and we can arrange any tests that you need without seeing you. We are only asking you to come to the practice if you need a specific examination that clearly cannot be done over the telephone, video or using photographs. It does have some positives for us all; it is more environmentally friendly; face to face appointment lengths can be tailored to your requirements; the time for you is less as you do not need to take time out of work to drive to us.

Keeping the villages connected.... Kilburn News

A Message from the Neighbourhood Watch Covid Response Team

Our community response team formed on Sunday 15th March 2020, a week before the country went into lockdown. From this date we collected emergency food bank items which we stored at the Kilburn Village Hall; so that should local families find themselves in hardship, we would be able to provide a small supply of food until they were able to access other services or access emergency finances provided by the Department of Work and Pensions or Derbyshire County Council.

From Monday 23rd March until now we have had a strong team of 30 volunteers mainly made up of teachers, nurses, paramedics and other essential workers who between them have supported our local communities in collecting prescriptions, essential shopping and items from the local food bank. **The breakdown in assistance is as follows:**

Moving forwards, we are looking to set up a formal community partnership as an umbrella organisation for the area to ensure that we can respond to any further incidents in the local community at a short notice. This is its infancy at present so further information will be available as and when we can provide it. In the meantime, we would like to thank everyone who helped during our community response.

still remains a challenge to us all and its impact could well be with us assess the temporary measures put for some considerable time. Hopefully, we will soon return to some form of normality, albeit with minor changes to our lifestyles. Advice on what you can and cannot do, changes regularly, so please use the Derbyshire County Council website, www.derbyshire.gov.uk to keep yourself updated.

Dealing and living with Covid-19

As you may have noticed, alterations to town centre layouts have taken place following a request from Government and a grant of £443k, to make them safe for shoppers and to bring our High Streets back to life in support of the local economy. Amber Valley Borough Council (AVBC) was fully involved in preparing these plans, before they were implemented, which have involved widening pavements, making some roads one-way, safe cycling and walking routes. Please note these changes are temporary. They are flexible and can be altered if they aren't working as successfully as we would like and improvements could be made. Again, you can provide feedback via the council website.

Heanor Library has reopened, albeit it is on an appointment basis at this time and you can borrow a maximum of 10 items. All currently borrowed books have been automatically renewed till 30th

September. I anticipate other local Libraries will start to reopen as we in place to ensure we can still offer this valued service, whilst keeping everyone as safe as possible. Personally, I use the online electronic eBook and eNewspaper service, I find it really good.

DCC has undertaken a short online survey asking parents how they intend their children to make the journey from home to school when the new academic year starts in September 2020. The Council currently organises and pays for home to school transport for 6,500 students, which is free of charge for primary pupils who live two miles from their normal area school and for secondary pupils who live 3 miles away. It is also provided for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities or an education, health and care plan. Surveys like this help us to plan for the future.

AVBC has recently published a budget update revealing it has received £42.6m additional Government funding this year to support local businesses, Council Tax Support and loss of Council income, and is anticipating a further grant of £700,000. The council has £4.9m in its General Reserve, with a current annual deficit of £1.7m rising to £2.8m next year.

AVBC will shortly be subject of an **Electoral Review which provides an** opportunity to shape the Council for the future. The review will look at Ward boundaries, size, number of councillors etc. AVBC currently has 45 councillors which represents the constituency boundary, as against the Derbyshire County Council, which has 10 councillors to represent the whole of the Amber Valley area. There will be future public consultation on this.

Please be advised that the mobile speed van is operating in the area.

AVBC has submitted its Strategic Housing & Economic Land Availability Plan, in support of its new Local Plan, asking for my comments. This Plan lists 137 housing sites, 72 being in Greenbelt, the rest is on Greenfield Land, with, I believe some on Brownfield sites. It states I cannot disclose any information about these sites. However, I am challenging the legality of this instruction. I am not prepared to comment until it is agreed that I can consult and engage with residents, so I can fully represent their views and concerns.

Raspberry Jam Drops

175g plain flour

½ tsp baking powder
175g butter (softened)
50g Tate & Lyle Caster Sugar
2 level tbsp Lyle's Golden Syrup
1 tsp vanilla extract
4 tbsp raspberry jam
25g cornflour



HOW TO MAKE THIS RECIPE

Line 2 or 3 baking trays with baking paper. Heat the oven to 180C/160Cfan/gas 4.

Sift the flour, cornflour and baking powder into a bowl.

Place the butter, Caster sugar and Lyle's Golden Syrup into a bowl and using and whisk, beat until pale and fluffy, add the vanilla extract. Fold in the dry ingredients until the mixture forms and soft dough.

Take small pieces of dough about the size of a walnut and roll into a ball walnut. Place on the baking tray, leaving room to spread, then repeat and make more balls.

Make an imprint into each ball using your finger, deep enough to hold a little jam. Carefully place a small blob of jam in each using about ¼ tsp jam.

Place in the oven for 15-20 minutes until lightly golden brown. Carefully transfer to a wire rack to cool completely. These cookies will keep in an airtight tin for up to 4 days.



Cubs, like the Scouts, played a number of games during their online meetings. They played Battleships; it was a big hit.


Beavers had a fun time during the lock down. We hope next week's 'Armpit' fudge will go down well. One thing is if the bag breaks they can tidy up back
