Men marched asleep. Many had lost their boots
But limped on, blood-shod. All went lame; all blind;
Drunk with fatigue; deaf even to the hoots
Of disappointed shells that dropped behind.

GAS! Gas! Quick, boys!-- An ecstasy of fumbling, Fitting the clumsy helmets just in time; But someone still was yelling out and stumbling And floundering like a man in fire or lime.-- Dim, through the misty panes and thick green light As under a green sea, I saw him drowning.

In all my dreams, before my helpless sight, He plunges at me, guttering, choking, drowning.

If in some smothering dreams you too could pace Behind the wagon that we flung him in, And watch the white eyes writhing in his face, His hanging face, like a devil's sick of sin; If you could hear, at every jolt, the blood Come gargling from the froth-corrupted lungs, Obscene as cancer, bitter as the cud Of vile, incurable sores on innocent tongues,—My friend, you would not tell with such high zest To children ardent for some desperate glory, The old Lie: Dulce et decorum est Pro patria mori.

The closing lines mean the old lie "that it is somehow sweet and fitting to die for your country in battle"

"Brooding Soldier" Memorial sited near St Julien near Ypres, Belgium, in memory of the first gas attack of April 1915, 100 years ago. 1915 saw the first use of chemical weapons in the form of chlorine gas used near Ypres on the 22nd April 1915.

Open Meeting/AGM 10th September 2015

This year's annual open meeting took place in the Old Oak Inn. It is the chance for any member of our community to have his or her say about this year's carnival and to make suggestions for next year's event. It had been hoped that the venue and its fine selection of ales would attract a strong turnout but apart from committee members, there were a disappointing nine attendees.

The evening began with the presentation of a new trophy for the Best Carnival Float which has been kindly donated by Dennis Cruise in memory of his late wife Janet Cruise. This year's winners were the Studio 7 Dance and Performance Arts School and we were very pleased that most of those who had organised or been on the float were present to receive their award from Dennis.



There has been a very positive response to this year's carnival which had an attendance of about 1,250, due to a mixture of traditional and new attractions and assisted no doubt by the glorious weather on the day. The few criticisms that were received have been noted and will be acted upon for next year's event. Next year is our Ruby (40th) Carnival and a very special event is already being planned.

Treasurer, Claire Hague, reported that expenditure on this year's carnival was £5,459 and income was a very healthy £6,290. Most of this was from grants (fewer this year), local sponsors and the entry fee but the refreshment tent and the raffle were also significant sources of revenue. A significant proportion of the profit has already been spent on the purchase of two second hand marquees which were used this year and will ensure that future carnival costs are kept as low as possible.

The AGM concluded with the election of officers and committee members and we are sadly losing two members this year who have been the mainstay of the carnival recently, namely our former Secretary, Vanessa Feeney and her sister, Kelly Vallance (Vice Chair). Alison Napier proposed a vote of thanks to both of them and commented that the carnival would not have been held for the last three years without all their hard work. Although they will no longer serve on the committee, thankfully both said they will be available for general advice and assistance. In spite of the low attendance, we are very pleased that we have two new committee members, and we look forward to welcoming them to the next committee meeting in October.

The minutes from the Open/AGM meeting will be placed in the Parish Council Notice Boards shortly.

Horsley Woodhouse Community Association relies on grants and sponsorship to run the carnival and keep the entrance fee as low as possible (children are free). Some of our grants are no longer available but we have been fortunate to be shortlisted on the 2015 Skipton Building Society Grassroots Giving

scheme, which offers a grant of £500 to community groups such as ours.

Marquee hire has been our largest single cost and this year the purchase of two second hand marquees has significantly reduced the annual costs of the carnival. If our bid is successful, we would use the Skipton Building Society grant to purchase another marquee which would be used for the craft tent. We would then not have to hire any marquees for future carnivals.

County Councillor Kevin Buttery - Keeping you Updated

It was great to see some of the world's top cyclists race through the village as part of Stage 6 of the Aviva Tour of Britain cycling race. Hopefully this will inspire some of us to become more active and take up cycling, as there are more than 300km of cycle ways in Derbyshire.

Digital Derbyshire is a £27.67 million programme aiming to transform superfast broadband throughout Derbyshire. It also aims to work with BT to ensure that premises will see an uplift in speed and deliver a minimum of 2Mbps. If your street is not regularly achieving this minimum speed please let me know.

I am pleased to support the Test Town Challenge. Heanor has been selected as one of only ten towns in the UK to host the Test Town Challenge, supporting young people and stimulating regeneration activity in the town. Young entrepreneurs aged 16 – 30 years are invited to participate in the challenge to showcase their ideas, business or service to the public and promote their concepts. The Test Town Market encourages the promotion and sale of goods as they launch their fledgling business. The project will also offer young people tailored business support in advance of the event to increase their knowledge and skills to ensure that they are business ready and will offer the support of business mentors. One lucky participant will receive the opportunity to base their business in the Enterprise Emporium in Heanor for the week to maximise their experience in the real world, before being nominated to go forward to the national Test Town final taking place early in 2016 where the overall prize winner has the chance to benefit from a prize worth £10,000 to support their business.

Fly-tipping appears to be on the increase. It is a crime, with a penalty of up to £50,000 or 12 months imprisonment. Please note that if your rubbish is fly-tipped you could also be prosecuted, even if you didn't dump it or know it was going to be dumped. No-one likes to see fly-tipping, it is unsightly, can be unsafe and is expensive to clear up. If you see someone dumping rubbish, take the registration number of the vehicle, description of those responsible, location and type of rubbish, then ring 'Call Derbyshire' on 01629 533190 to report it.
