Holiday Planning

As I prepare for a trip away I think about things I can do to help me have a good holiday without the worries of a medical drama whilst away. It is worth making some preparations:

Do I need any vaccinations?

Don't leave this too late. We can provide you with a list of those you have had but you will need to seek advice about what is needed on <u>https://travelhealthpro.org.uk/</u> or <u>https://www.fitfortravel.nhs.uk/home.aspx</u>.

We can give you some standard vaccinations on the NHS (with at least six weeks' notice) but we will now not be able to provide any chargeable vaccinations or malaria tablets so you will need to attend a local travel clinic.

Do I get travel sickness?

You can get some tablets from the chemist. You will need to take these before you travel.

How do I react to simple stings and bites? Take some antihistamines with you to help reduce the redness, swelling and itching.

Do I want to avoid wrinkles or, worse, skin cancer?

Get plenty of sun protection with screens, hats and light clothing.

Am I prone to 'Delhi belly'?

For tummy upsets take some Imodium, rehydration salts, anti-sickness tablets, and for prevention, alcohol gel if hand washing is not possible.

Do I get aches and pains?

Take your usual over the counter pain killers that you know work for you.

Are you taking prescriptions medications?

Make sure that you have enough for your holiday and check that the country you are visiting allows you to take these with you. Take a simple First Aid kit.

You can access <u>https://www.nhs.uk/</u> and <u>https://patient.info/</u> from abroad. These are useful reliable sites that you can get advice when dealing with minor ailments.

Remember your E111 card for travel in the EU but this will only cover emergency care and you may still have to pay up front. So make sure that your travel insurance is up to date and includes **all** your medical conditions to make sure that a claim doesn't get rejected.

Now pack some clothes, passport and have a wonderful holiday and hopefully you won't need to open anything have you have taken and keep it for the next holiday!

Councillor Kevin Buttery – Keeping you Updated

Please be vigilant of scams, fraudsters are currently calling people to say they are due a refund on their council tax, or even a discount if they pay future council tax in advance, asking them to provide their bank or credit card details. Amber Valley Borough Council never contact residents in this way. In some cases, residents have been asked for their name and address so that a cheque can be sent. This is followed up by another telephone call claiming to be from their bank, asking them to confirm their banking details. One man was told that his bill for next year was due now and that unless he paid it in full straight away he could face a £7,000 fine. This is not something the council would ever do. In other incidents residents have been asked for upfront payments to receive a reduction on next year's bill. There is no such reduction scheme. For advice on scams you can call **Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline** on 03454 040 506 or to report a scam, contact Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040.

Amber Valley Borough Council is required by law to have a Local Plan which sets out the strategic priorities for development in the Borough. This covers housing, commercial, public and private development, including transport infrastructure, along with protection for the local environment. Any Council failing to have a Local Plan in place to meet Government housing targets will have its planning rights taken away, as well as the withdrawal of its New Homes Bonus, which Councils use to support front line services.

In Amber Valley's case, the housing target was set at 9,700 homes, of which it has a legal obligation to provide over 2,000 homes on behalf of Derby City. The process is that the Council asks landowners and developers to submit sites for consideration. These sites are then measured against robust planning principles to address their deliverability and sustainability. Any sites proposed are examined by an independent Government Planning Inspector, who decides whether to adopt the plan, plus whether developers will build sufficient houses within a five year period, known as a five year supply. Amber Valley would have a five year supply without having the burden of Derby City's housing.

The Council initially had over 129 sites submitted, of which only 19 sites were put forward to be considered by the Planning Inspector. With eight of these sites

being Brownfield. It should be noted that 54 of the sites were in the Green Belt, 53 of which were not considered acceptable. The Council was pushed to undertake a Green Belt review in 2017. It took the decision not to, making it clear it would do everything possible to prevent having to undertake such a review by finding sufficient sites without one; which developers challenged. However, it was conceded that, after 30 years, and faced with a pausation by the **Government Planning** Inspector to find additional sites, a Green Belt Review was undertaken by an independent company.

Many people ask me why the Council does not make developers build on Brownfield sites first. In reality, it has no powers to do so. Plus, after the Green Belt review, out of the 14 extra sites proposed, five are Brownfield, making that 13 Brownfield sites out of 33 in total. There are also 150 Brownfield sites currently with planning permission, which account for 1,047 homes. The additional sites the Council is proposing for consideration to be included in the Local Plan is being sent to the **Government Planning**

Inspector, residents have six weeks to make representation direct to the Government Planning Inspector against any particular site. I urge you to do so, to ensure your concerns are heard and taken into account during her decisionmaking process. Please note any site included, will still have to go through a stringent planning process, in which, once again, you will have the opportunity to raise your concerns. Copies of the consultation documents are available on Amber Valley's Council website on www.ambervalley.gov.uk/ localplanlatest and at local libraries. There will also be five meetings held in which council officers will be available to answer questions on the consultation documents, details on the website.

The County Council has responded to the Government's Fair Funding review pointing out there appears to be a bias towards London Boroughs, cities and the south of England which puts Derbyshire at a disadvantage. We rank in the bottom 10 of worst funded councils. On a level playing field, Derbyshire would have up to an extra £300 to spend per resident on providing services. One off or short-term funding is helpful, but you cannot plan future services on that, it needs building into the baseline budget. We are urging Derbyshire MP's to back our campaign to ensure Derbyshire gets its fair share.




